



THE WARTIME BOOK CLUB by Kate Thompson

Set on the Channel Islands at the time of the German occupation WWII based on a true story.

The young librarian, Grace, hides books from the Germans. Her best friend Bea, a post woman, rebels at everything she can at the occupation. A book club is formed to give the Islanders some normalities in their lives. Hunger is rife and villagers turn informers for the reward. Bea starts intercepting letters from locals to the Germans and enlists Grace to help pass on warnings as she delivers books. They are being watched and their lives are in great danger and when they are finally arrested suffer shocking atrocities.



I was unsure about reading another "Book Club" book, but this story was quite different from the last one I read. A love story as well as a story of bravery and resilience based on true events. I thoroughly enjoyed this book and can recommend.




