


This turned out to be a great read with even a few tears! So glad I didn't put it down.

Bloke's Morning Tea - October Report

The 17 Blokes who attended the Oct Meeting were entertained with an interesting Video that showed Sea Trials of old technologies like Large Spinnakers and "Flettner" rotors, large, 100 ft tall spinning cylinders that generate forward thrust from the wind, reducing the load on the main engines to assist propulsion being retrofitted onto existing container and oil tankers to improve efficiency and cut fuel costs. Fuel bills can be cut by up to 20% and lower greenhouse gas emissions. This technology, originally developed in the 1920s, is being updated with modern materials like carbon fibre and is being tested on ferries and tankers. While a major technical challenge, ports like Hamburg are now offering shore power to container ships and cruise liners.

Village Church Service—October Report

Leonie Linton from St Mary's Anglican Church gave a very interesting message, about the Anglican Church service, Blessing the Animals. This annual service is on the Sunday nearest St Francis of Assisi Day, October 4th. Today, other denominations follow the Anglican / Catholic tradition, Blessing the Animals.



Who was Francis of Assisi? He was the handsome, witty son of a wealthy Italian trader who enjoyed the high life and spending money lavishly on himself and not others. During his interesting life he joined the military; and another happening was spending over a year in prison. During his time there he began to re- evaluate his life and displayed disillusionment toward the material world.

It was Francis mission in life to implore people to act in a way God expected of them. He set out to replicate Christ and literally carry out Christ's work. What more could be asked of a Christian, and what could we learn from him. Besides caring for the poor Francis became a steward for the Earth God had created 800 years ago

Francis knew that stewardship of creation meant the caretaking of the environment and animals, as well as our families and communities. Our created environment and all it contains is still evolving, it must be loved and protected by us all. God encourages us all to be stewards following the example set by St Francis of Assisi.

Leonie's husband Murray read the 3 bible readings- Genesis 1: 25, Proverbs 12: 10, & Corinthians 4:2.
